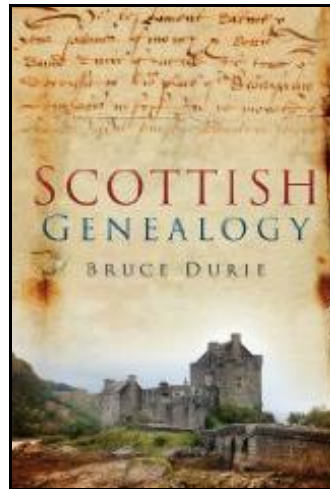

New Book on Scottish Genealogy



A new book by Bruce Durie entitled *Scottish Genealogy* has just been released (2009) by The History Press. It not only covers sources and records (both physical and electronic), it is also firmly based on established genealogical practice, with worked examples which will enable family historians everywhere to exploit the rich resources in Scotland. Scotland probably has the most complete and best-kept set of records and other documents in the world. But given both this fact and the worldwide Scottish Diaspora (approximately 28 million people can claim Scottish ancestry), the lack of a thorough guide to Scottish genealogy is a significant gap. Durie's book bridges that gap with authority and provides a sense of the excitement of the historical chase. He shows researchers how to get beyond the standard 'births, marriages and deaths and census' search and how to dig deeper in.

Dr. Durie teaches Genealogy Studies at the University of Strathclyde, Glasgow, and is the author of several books on local history and related subjects to genealogy.
